Dear Beloved Family of God

Happy Easter! I find a surprising truth rising from our culture: even in an age of skepticism, Americans are still believing. In her yearlong project titled "Believing," (New York Times, April 21, 2025), Lauren Jackson explores the enduring and evolving spiritual lives of Americans. Despite rising secularization in previous decades, 92% of U.S. adults now express some form of spiritual belief. Religion is re-emerging in public life, from politics to tech, and a generational shift seems to be underway. Jackson, who left the Mormon Church, interviewed thousands to understand how people grapple with belief today—inside and outside organized religion.

The article reveals that while millions left institutional faith in past decades, many found secular substitutes like fitness classes or mindfulness apps ultimately unfulfilling. Religion often fulfills core psychological needs—offering belief, belonging, and behavior. People of faith generally report better mental and physical health.

Though not all are returning to church, there's a growing desire for spaces where spiritual reflection can thrive. This resurgence suggests Americans are searching for meaning, community, and deeper conversations around values like confession, forgiveness, and purpose.

We have Jesus who came to offer forgiveness, a chance to confess and **be** forgiven, **and** an opportunity to be right with God and with others. The first of his last seven sayings from the cross was about forgiveness. The first word after Easter to his disciples was also about forgiveness. His life, death, and resurrection were all his efforts to make sure **that** access to God **was** possible for all those who confess and forgive. Easter, the resurrection of Jesus, was the final act of God to complete it. Because of Easter, **the** disciples knew they were forgiven. Their Lord, who was betrayed by them, was risen from the dead. Their guilts were lifted up, and they were driven to spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ with the undeniable conviction of the resurrection of the Lord.

Over the past 30 years, I have witnessed more and more churches refraining from mentioning the name of Jesus. Whenever I go to various churches to preach, people say to me, "Thank you for preaching about Jesus." Every time, I am taken aback. Christianity is a gathering of those who follow Jesus, and we are those who believe in the God revealed and taught by Jesus, so why should I receive such a greeting? If I don't talk about Jesus, what else am I supposed to preach?

In America, where various races with diverse cultures and religions live together, it is right to respect all religions. However, losing the identity of Christianity and abandoning our core truths is a suicidal act. We can genuinely respect other religions when we stand firm as true Christians and healthy disciples of Jesus. This is because we hope that Buddhists will live as true Buddhists and Muslims as true Muslims.

People are searching for the meaning of life. They desire true salvation and joy in life. When they come to our church, they will want to encounter the real Jesus, not a fake window-dressing Jesus. We must first understand Jesus well, sincerely follow Him, and show His life. I earnestly pray that our church will be a place that gives living water to the thirsty.

I hope and pray that during this Easter season and beyond, we continue to learn about Jesus, practice the ways of Jesus, and to spread the truth of Jesus always and everywhere.

I enjoy so much the time I spend with our children at Sunday School! They are eager to learn more about God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit. As we talk and share together, they are musing about the lives of the Bible characters, their circumstances and their choices. They ask funny and deep questions about the meaning of things. Seeing their faces light up with understanding is the greatest joy.

We have one class that includes late 3 yr. olds to 11-year-old students. Attendance currently ranges from 3-10 students. There are 4 teachers who rotate through the month. Curriculum is provided.

I hope you all enjoyed a happy Easter! I believe that we are lucky because when we arrive at Easter Sunday, we know what happened. We know that the tomb was empty – we know that Christ was raised from the dead just as he said, and we know that Christ will come again. The disciples watched their beloved teacher die; they were sad and afraid. On that first Easter the women arrived at the tomb only to find it empty. They were told that Jesus had been raised and that they would see him again. It must have been both wonderful and shocking for those that met the risen Christ that first Easter. Jesus' resurrection requires that we see beyond what appears and instead allow the Holy Spirit to work in and through us. Jesus' death was NOT the end for Jesus or for us. Jesus' life, death and resurrection give us hope for the future. God keeps his promises – Christ will come again!

On Easter Sunday, Pastor asked what resurrection means for each of us. The women who were going to the tomb just wanted to honor Jesus by anointing him with spices, but they were worried about how they might move the stone to conduct the ritual. Of course, when they arrived, they found that stone had been moved, and Jesus was not there. Pastor asked us to consider what stones/worries we carry. We all have burdens, but we can take those worries to God in prayer. There are times when our worries seem so big that we can't find the words to pray. The good news is that God knows – God is already there – God knows our needs. Despite our circumstances, we can have hope because of Jesus' resurrection. Death is not the final word. Nothing can take away our hope or separate us from God. God lifts us up as his beloved, forgiven, and redeemed children. We all struggle, we all make mistakes, but those mistakes don't have to define your life. Remember Easter was NOT the end – it's a new beginning filled with hope and light.

I wish you all a Spring bright with promise and hope for the future. No matter what burdens you carry, you are loved, and you can know that God walks with you. God will go before you and take your hand – embrace the journey – trust and hope.

Do I need to attend United Women in Faith meetings?

You do not need to attend the United Women in Faith (UWF) meetings to take part in the fun. Of course, we'd love to see you there! If you've been wanting to attend but need a ride, please reach out to one of us to coordinate transportation.

Important dates:

- Come to the May meeting on 5/19/25 to participate in a random drawing to assign Secret Sisters. If you are not able to attend, we'll mail you your assignment.
- At the September meeting (9/15/25), we'll reveal the identity of your Secret Sister. If you cannot attend, we'll mail the information to you.

Is it expensive?

Cards and/or gifts for your Secret Sister should not cost a lot of money. Many sweet, simple and delightful surprises can be found for \$10 or less. How often you surprise your Secret Sister is up to you, though a good guide is to aim for one surprise per month.

How do I keep it a secret?

Delivering a gift while keeping it a secret can be tricky! Here are some suggestions:

- Order an online gift and include a gift receipt from "Your Secret Sister"
- Place a gift on the small table in the Fellowship Hall for your gift recipient to pick up (choose this option only if you're fairly certain your gift recipient attends regularly)
- Drive by your gift recipient's home and leave it on the porch, preferably not in view from the street, where porch pirates will see it! Also, watch out for video doorbells!
