Dear Beloved Family of God,

Have you ever experienced the profound peace of walking a Labyrinth? Our Trustees and Ad Council are excited to share a vision for our Second Street Lawn – to create a beautiful, spiritual Labyrinth for our church and the wider community. A portion of our Capital Fundraising will be dedicated to bringing this inspiring project to life.

For decades, our Second Street Lawn has offered a welcome green space. However, maintaining its lushness through the summer demands significant water. We believe it's time to transform this area into something new, yet equally dedicated to serving as a peaceful and comforting haven. Our hope is for a space that nurtures not only the soul but also offers tranquility for the body, all while being a more sustainable presence.

My own introduction to the power of a Labyrinth came nearly 25 years ago at a Korean-American UMC Clergywomen's Gathering in Colorado. In the basement of a United Methodist Church, a large, 18-foot Labyrinth print was laid out for about 40 of us. As we began to walk, one by one, tears began to flow. We felt an overwhelming presence of Christ, touching each of us who carried wounds from our ministry fields – from sexism, racism, or cultural discrimination. We spent over three hours in that sacred space, and everyone emerged renewed with healing and spiritual strength. It is my fervent hope and prayer that we can soon offer this gift to our community, allowing many to benefit from its grace.

What is a Labyrinth Prayer Walk?

A Labyrinth prayer walk is a form of walking meditation. It involves journeying along a single, winding path towards a central point and back out again. The Labyrinth itself is a symbolic representation of one's spiritual journey, with the center often signifying a state of peace, enlightenment, or connection with the Divine.

To help you engage with this spiritual practice, here are some gentle guidelines:

- Entering the Labyrinth: Approach with an open heart. You might set a specific intention, offer a prayer, or simply decide to be present.
- Walking the Path: As you walk, quiet your mind and focus on your intention or your breath. Allow space for contemplation and spiritual reflection.
- Reaching the Center: The center is a place for pause, peace, rest, or deeper connection. Receive what is offered.
- Walking Back Out: The return journey can be a time for releasing concerns, integrating insights gained, or carrying newfound peace with you.
- Various Approaches: Some individuals pray specific prayers or recite scripture. Others may focus on their breath, a sacred word, or simply the act of walking. There is no single "right" way.

The practice of walking a Labyrinth offers numerous benefits:

- Stress Reduction: The slow, mindful walk can quiet the mind, ease anxiety, and reduce stress.
- Spiritual Connection: It serves as a powerful tool for deepening one's spiritual practice and fostering a connection with God.
- Self-Reflection: The journey provides a dedicated space for contemplation on one's life path and spiritual growth.
- Creativity: The focused, meditative movement can often unlock new insights and stimulate creativity.
- Mindfulness: Walking the Labyrinth encourages a profound focus on the present moment, cultivating mindfulness and heightened awareness.

We are truly excited about the prospect of this Labyrinth and the spiritual enrichment it will offer. We look forward to sharing more as this vision unfolds.



I enjoy so much the time I spend with our children at Sunday School! They are eager to learn more about God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit. As we talk and share together, they are musing about the lives of the Bible characters, their circumstances and their choices. They ask funny and deep questions about the meaning of things. Seeing their faces light up with understanding is the greatest joy.

We have one class that includes late 3 yr. olds to 11-year-old students. Attendance currently ranges from 3-10 students. There are 4 teachers who rotate through the month. Curriculum is provided.

I invite you to join in this experience as our Sunday School classes become larger. To strengthen our Sunday School, I need:

1-2 additional adults to teach 5<sup>th</sup> Sundays and Substitute. Curriculum is provided

4-5 high schoolers or adults to assist the teacher once monthly. Tasks would include taking attendance, assisting with crafts and activities, and accompanying students who need to leave the classroom.

### Lay Leader News By Heidi Stark

As Easter people we are called to live with hope and light, and I am doing my best to do just that. During the service on May 18, I shared that I have breast cancer. This diagnosis came as quite a shock. I went in for a routine mammogram on April 15 and on May 16 I got the call. In between there had been more imaging, ultrasounds, and a biopsy. I'm thankful that I've always been diligent about mammograms and other preventative health assessments, and I am thankful that we have the medical technology to find and detect health issues. I was able to meet with a surgeon on May 18, and my surgery will be on May 29. By the time you read this I will be home recovering and waiting for the surgery pathology to determine the treatment plan. My understanding is that at the very least I should expect to have radiation, but chemotherapy may also be required. Again, I'm thankful to have a medical team planning the best course of action for my cancer situation, and I have a very positive prognosis. I am blessed to have the love, support and prayers of my family, friends, Church, and so many people I don't even know lifting me up. I am thankful!

When I got the call that I had cancer, I cried! I was scared and I still am - things are happening fast and it's a lot to take in. I'm a planner and I'm organized; this diagnosis is turning my world upside down. One thing our family has not widely shared but is now necessary is that my husband, Luiz was diagnosed with Alzheimer's in February and his diagnosis is a challenge on its own. I'm used to taking care of everyone and everything, and now it has become abundantly clear that I must focus on getting rid of this cancer so that I can continue to help others. It is very disconcerting to not know what will happen next. I'm having a hard time wrapping my head around the idea that I am "sick". I don't feel sick, and I don't think I look sick, and it's hard to comprehend that the treatments that can cure me of this cancer will likely make me feel sick for a while. I'm learning that I can allow others to help because I certainly can't do it all by myself. It's a lot right now, but I don't blame God. God did not give me cancer or Luiz Alzheimer's – things happen – suffering is a part of life - it's temporary, and God walks with us through all of it.


I love BCUMC, and I love serving at BCUMC as a communion steward, worship leader, Administrative Council Chair and co-Lay Leader with Dave Funk. I don't want my life to change but I must change it right now. So, I have shared with Pastor that I need to step down as Ad. Council Chair and step back as Lay Leader. I hope to continue as a worship leader and communion steward as I'm able. I love being a Lay Leader, and I'd like to continue to write and participate as I can, but it may be necessary to find a new Lay Leader. I don't know how the rest of the year will go for me or Luiz, but I do know that this is a season of life, and we will just have to wait and see what comes next – trust God's timing and plan. I do know that I am not alone – I know that I am loved and supported. Thank you! God is good all the time and this too shall pass.
